About Us:

The Network of TB Champions is an advocacy network that brings together individuals and communities affected by tuberculosis. Our goal is to advocate for the rights and needs of TB-affected individuals, mobilize communities, raise awareness, and support strategies that contribute to the elimination of TB in Kenya

Our Vision:

- Advocate on behalf of TB-affected communities and support the development of policies and programs that enhance TB prevention and care in Kenya.
- Support resource mobilization efforts, including grant writing, donor engagement, and identifying new funding opportunities to sustain NTBC's mission and programs.

Candidate Criteria:

Candidates for the Board will be expected to meet the following criteria:

- Demonstrate strong leadership skills and relevant experience in executive or board roles.
- Show a deep commitment to the mission and values of the organization.
- Possess relevant expertise in areas such as healthcare management, advocacy, fundraising, resource mobilization, grant writing, organizational management, finance, legal affairs, or marketing.
- Be willing and able to dedicate sufficient time and effort to fulfill board responsibilities.
- Uphold high ethical standards.
- Demonstrate the ability to work collaboratively with other board members, staff, and stakeholders.

Desired Qualifications:

We are seeking passionate and committed individuals with experience and expertise in one or more of the following areas:

- 1. **Healthcare:** Experience in public health, TB, or infectious diseases.
- 2. **Advocacy:** Knowledge of advocacy strategies and the ability to engage with policymakers and stakeholders.
- 3. **Governance:** Experience serving on boards, understanding of good governance practices.
- 4. **Fundraising and Resource Mobilization:** Experience in fundraising, grant writing, and building partnerships with donors and stakeholders.
- 5. **Community Engagement:** A strong understanding of community dynamics, particularly among TB-affected populations.
- 6. **Legal or Financial Expertise:** Background in law, finance, or accounting to strengthen the Board's governance and oversight functions.

Nomination Process:

Board members may also be nominated by individuals or organizations, provided that:

- The nominee meets the qualification criteria listed above.
- The nominee has consented to the nomination.
- The nominating party has notified the nominee of their intention and received their consent.



Commitment:

This is a voluntary position. Board members are expected to:

- Attend quarterly Board meetings (in-person or virtually).
- Participate in at least one committee (e.g., finance, advocacy, governance).
- Serve a three-year term, renewable once upon re-election.
- Actively participate in NTBC's activities and represent the network at events and stakeholder meetings.
