

# Board Chairperson: Michael Macharia - Public Health Clinical Specialist

Michael is a seasoned public health professional with over 14 years of experience in tuberculosis (TB), HIV/AIDS, and other infectious diseases. A skilled leader in public health programming, policy development, and community engagement, he has dedicated his career to advancing equitable, evidence-based healthcare interventions for vulnerable populations.

As a key member of Kenya's TB Committees of Experts (COEs), including the Drug-Resistant TB COE and the TB Health Sector Working Group, Michael has been instrumental in shaping national TB strategies and guidelines. His contributions include playing a pivotal role in the development of the Kenya National Strategic Plan for Tuberculosis, Leprosy, and Lung Health 2024–2028, as well as the Multi-Sectoral Accountability Framework for TB, among other critical policies.

Currently, Michael serves as the regional lead for Western Kenya at the Kenya Conference of Catholic Bishops (KCCB), where he oversees TB service delivery across supported health facilities in four counties. Under his leadership, TB treatment success rates have consistently ranged from 90–92%, and TB mortality has been reduced by 40%.

Michael is also experienced in resource mobilization and grant management, having been integral to the successful application and implementation of the Challenge Facility for Civil Society Round 11 grant in Bungoma and supporting STOP TB-K in securing funding for Round 12.

In addition to his technical expertise, Michael is deeply committed to strengthening community health systems and promoting human rights-based approaches to healthcare. His work emphasizes collaboration with civil society organizations, government agencies, and donors to ensure person-centered care and scalable impact.

Michael holds a Bachelor of Science in Public Health from Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology and has completed various professional certifications, including Leadership and Management in Health and Economic Evaluation in Global Health from the University of Washington.

As a trusted advocate and technical expert, Michael continues to be a leading figure in Kenya's fight against TB and other infectious diseases, leveraging his strategic insight, technical skills, and passion for health equity.

**Erick Okioma** is a dynamic TB-HIV grassroots campaigner, community health advocate, and transformative leader whose ability to bridge gaps between communities and policymakers has brought impactful change in Kisumu County and beyond. With over 19 years of experience in Kenya's civil service, managing construction projects in the Ministry of Public Works, Erick transitioned to full-time community service, dedicating over two decades to advocacy, capacity building, and resource mobilization for vulnerable populations affected by TB and HIV.

Erick holds a Graduate Diploma in Community Development and Resource Mobilization and a Diploma in Project Management, alongside specialized training in HIV/AIDS program management, HIV testing and counseling, research ethics, and resource mobilization. This solid educational background complements his practical efforts in addressing complex community challenges.

As the Chapter Lead for the Network of TB Champions Kenya, Kisumu Chapter, and Team Leader of the Nelson Mandela TB HIV Information CBO, which he co-founded in 2014, Erick has spearheaded initiatives that support youth, adolescent girls, and persons with disabilities. He has also coordinated impactful projects like the Wezesha Dada Project, empowering adolescent girls through digital literacy and media advocacy, and mobilized communities as the National Coordinator for the AIDS Candlelight Memorial in Kenya to combat stigma and raise awareness about HIV.

Erick is a passionate human rights advocate, with extensive training from organizations like KELIN and ARASA. He champions the rights of people living with HIV and actively campaigns for equitable healthcare access. His contributions to research and policy advocacy are strengthened by his membership in multiple Community Advisory Boards (CABs), driving evidence-based solutions to health challenges.

A strong proponent of community-led solutions, Erick is dedicated to ensuring that health interventions are inclusive, sustainable, and informed by the realities of those they aim to serve. His leadership has been pivotal in developing Kisumu County's Digital Health Roadmap, coordinating the HIV Stigma Index Survey, and organizing major health-related events such as World AIDS Day and TB Day. His skills also extend to sports coaching, farming, and mentorship, which he uses to inspire and engage youth.

Erick's advocacy extends to the global stage, where he represents Kenya in forums addressing human rights, digital health, and community empowerment. Recognized for his leadership and impact, he has received numerous awards and certificates of appreciation for his contributions to HIV research, stigma reduction, and public health campaigns.

With a vision for sustainable change, Erick continues to lead impactful initiatives and empower communities, creating ripples of transformation in Kisumu County and beyond.



National Coordinator / Secretary to the Board : **Stephen Anguva Shikoli - Human Rights Activist** 

Stephen holds multiple roles in various organizations, demonstrating his extensive commitment to advocating for tuberculosis (TB) patients and combating stigma. He serves as the National Coordinator of the Network of TB Champions Kenya and is actively involved in global and national working groups such as The Global Coalition of Tuberculosis Activists. Stephen represents TB-affected persons in the Kenya TB Health Sector Working Group and contributes to the Kenya Human Rights Technical Working Group.

Stephen's journey began in 2009 when he battled TB amid stigma and discrimination, which inspired him to establish the Pamoja TB Group. As the Executive Director, he leads advocacy efforts for improved TB services and addresses stigma issues in Nairobi. Stephen's leadership led Pamoja TB Group to implement the Impact4TB TPT Advocacy Project, supported by Treatment Action Group Grants since 2020. His dedication was recognized with the PEPFAR Heroes Award in 2021 for ensuring uninterrupted TB services during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Stephen has been instrumental in planning the World TB Day National events since 2015, focusing on integrating TB-affected communities into TB control efforts. He played key roles in international events, including attending UNHLM on TB in New York in 2018 and 2023 and participating in the first TB Survivors summit in Hyderabad, India, in 2019.

Currently, Stephen works as a Data Manager and Lead Field Assistant for Malteser International's Global Fund TB project in Nairobi. He was part of the delegation that attended the Multi-Sector Hearing on TB, UHC, and PPPR in New York in May 2023, advocating for TB awareness globally.

Stephen's involvement extends to various committees and panels, including serving as Chair of KAVI-ICR Kangemi CAB and representing Kenya in the SMART4TB Afro CAB under a USAID project. He is also a member of the National Steering Committee for PLHIV Stigma Index 2.0 and contributes to the development of TB legal frameworks and human rights assessments in Kenya.

Throughout his career, Stephen has used his platform to amplify the voices of TB patients globally, advocating for better health services and human rights protections

Timpiyian Leseni is a Tuberculosis advocate with an ongoing bachelor of art degree in community development before being a TB advocate, she was trained as a computer technician maintaining and optimizing computer systems both hardware and software.

Timpiyian current responsibilities include educating the community on the signs and symptoms of tuberculosis both pulmonary and extra pulmonary (Zoonotic TB) and the importance of adherence, forming psychosocial support groups for TB patient, contact tracing, lost to follow up, strengthening community health facility linkages on TB/HIV, educating the Maasai community on the importance of building their traditional houses with proper ventilation. She was involved in reviewing the National strategic plan for Tuberculosis, leprosy and lung health, trained on human rights, gender and data for key population tools for TB/HIV. 2015-2017 an alternate member for TB constituency in Kenya Coordinating Mechanism for Global Fund and in 2016 she was selected a member of WHO Civil Society Task Force and a member of the WHO guideline development group.
